

C&Y Postdoc Grant and Pasteur Network Postdoc Grant

Guidelines for candidates

These guidelines pertain to candidates applying for either a Calmette & Yersin (C&Y) Postdoc Grant or a Pasteur Network Postdoc grant.

The grants are a fixed amount of €100,000 for a 24-month period, covering various aspects such as the Postdoc's salary, mobility, training, publication costs. It is important to note that the grant is solely dedicated to the successful candidate for the postdoc.

The host institution oversees the management of the grant and the administrative support of the grantee. Should a successful candidate decide to interrupt his/her postdoc, the grant will cease, and any remaining funds must be reimbursed to the organization managing the grant.

Furthermore, these grants are distributed equally among the regions within the Pasteur Network, ensuring fair access and opportunities across the network's geographical areas.

Eligibility Criteria

- Applicants must seek a full-time postdoc position within one of the member institutions of the Pasteur Network.
- They should have a doctoral degree from anywhere in the world and no more than 5 years of postdoctoral research experience.
- Proposals submitted must align with the focus areas of the call.
- Applications must be submitted online by the deadline, either in English or French.
- Proposed projects should cover the entire 2-year duration of the postdoc.
- All nationalities are eligible.
- Demonstrated geographical mobility is an advantage.
- Applications for units hosting Pasteur Network Postdoc for less than two (2) years are not eligible.

Evaluation Criteria

Applications will be evaluated based on the candidate's background as well as on the quality and originality of the proposed research project.

Process

1. Online application by the candidate
2. Eligibility check by the Pasteur Network Postdoc program manager
3. Review of each application by two members of the P4P committee.
4. Ranking of the candidates by the P4P committee.
5. Final decision by the executive management in charge of the programmes.
6. Notification to the candidates by the Postdoc program manager. It's important to note that unsuccessful candidates will not receive detailed feedback regarding the reasons for not being shortlisted or offered a traineeship.
7. If a selected candidate withdraws, the scholarship will be awarded to the first candidate on the complementary list.
8. The start date may be delayed no longer than 3 months for administrative reasons.
9. Successful candidates will provide an annual report to the Pasteur Network Postdoc program manager.
